LBGT+ labour and the role in development: a recent literature review

Lesbians, gays, bisexuals, transgender or transexual, and other groups such as queer, intersexual, asexual included in the "plus" sign suffer from different kinds of rejection and violence that difficult their lives in the labour market.

This paper aims to review the common ideas about the struggles faced by the community and mostly investigate how the field is addressing the issue of economic exclusion and its downsides in development. For that reason a literature review was chosen as a fitted methodology so would be possible to undertand from diffent points of view allongside a deeper analysis of diffent outcomes and a web of constructed knowledge.

All of this begined with the wish to comprehende how queer people, here used as a sinonym of LGBT+, participate in economic processes and how important they are even thought they are being neglected. Also it is truly significant see what policies succeded in promoting more equality helping the improvement of economic activities. Finally, I provide some overal directions to further studies arguing in favor of more statistical analysis and ways the area can be enriched.

2. Methodology

2.1 Literature Review

For this study I have done a vast literature review focusing on understanding the origins of the field of research, its most important concepts and evolution towards the new demands to understand LGBT inclusion.

As a student of International Economic Relations I was presented with Weber [1] work about Queer International Relations the most significant book about queer perspectives looking to the global order with special attention to the internationak political economy arguing that the global economy is not simply a neutral and apolitical force, but rather, it is deeply intertwined with political and social hierarchies that are based on identity categories such as sexuality. Her book also highlights that global capitalism has had complex and often contradictory impacts on queer communities, because has also exacerbated existing inequalities while creating oportunities.

Used as reference in Weber [1] work, Dugan []examines how interests of the wealthy are privileged over the working-class and marginalized communities were manifested in areas such as education, healthcare, and housing, and how it has contributed to the widening income gap and the concentration of power in the hands of the few.

Both books highlight the importance of examining power relations and their impact on marginalized communities. Duggan examines the ways in which neoliberal policies have contributed to the erosion of social equality, while Weber explores how dominant discourses and practices in international relations marginalize queer individuals and communities.

Additionally, both books call for a critical examination of dominant narratives and structures. Duggan critiques the dominant narrative of the American Dream and calls for a rejection of neoliberal policies, while Weber critiques the dominant heteronormative and patriarchal structures in international relations and calls for a deconstruction of these structures.

Finally, both books emphasize the importance of centering marginalized voices and perspectives in any efforts towards social justice. Duggan highlights the importance of intersectionality in understanding and addressing inequalities, while Weber argues for the inclusion of queer perspectives in the study and practice of international relations.

In reason of the importance of seeing a queer perspective on economics that could help to broaden the understanding of economic phenomena Jacobsen [7] challenges the traditional assumptions and frameworks of economics that have often overlooked or marginalized LGBTQ+ people and their experience. It deals with the gender wage gap and discrimination in the workplace, and can offer innovative solutions to economic problems.

Section 6 focuses specifically on the workplace experiences of LGBTQ+ people. The authors explore the ways in which discrimination and harassment can impact job opportunities, job satisfaction, and productivity. They also examine the potential benefits of workplace diversity and inclusion, as well as the challenges and limitations of current antidiscrimination laws. It's one of the earlier studies showing empirical evidence of the prejudice distorcing the labour market.

This section examines the role of LGBTQ+ entrepreneurship in economic development, both at the individual and community levels. More recent studies have been made by Badget [2] [3] since 2014 using broader data to show The relationship between LGBT= inclusion and economic development. It uses a macro-level analysis to investigate the impact of that inclusion on a country's economic development.

The article starts with a brief introduction to the community and their economic contributions. The authors note that persons and businesses contribute significantly to the economy, but they also face significant discrimination and barriers to economic participation in many parts of the world.

The study uses several measures of LGBT+ inclusion, including legal protections, social attitudes, and the presence of organizations. The authors then analyze the relationship between these measures and various indicators of economic development, such as GDP per capita, economic growth, and income inequality.

The results of the analysis suggest that lesser exclusion is associated with higher levels of economic development. Specifically, countries with stronger legal protections for queer people tend to have higher levels of economic development. Additionally, countries with more positive social attitudes towards individuals and a higher presence of LGBT+ organizations also tend to have higher levels of economic development.

The authors note that the relationship is complex and may be influenced by a variety of factors. For example, countries with higher levels of economic development may be more likely to adopt policies that protect queer rights. Additionally, the higher particiapation may contribute to economic development by fostering innovation and attracting talented individuals to a country.

Overall, there are valuable insights into the relationship suggest that promoting LGBT inclusion may not only have social and ethical benefits but also economic benefits. The article also highlights the need for further research on this topic, particularly at the micro-level, to better understand the mechanisms underlying this relationship.

In Vu [5] there is a new look the relationship between LGBT inclusion and national innovative capacity. The works of Weber and Duggan call for the deconstruction of dominant structures and the inclusion of queer perspectives in international relations and economics. The study by Jacobsen sheds light on the discrimination and harassment that LGBT+ individuals face in the workplace and the potential benefits of workplace diversity and inclusion. The study by Badgett et al. suggests that there is a positive correlation between LGBT+ inclusion and economic development, and the study by Vu [5] argues that queer inclusion is an important deerminant of a country's innovative capacity. These studies underscore the need for greater attention to be paid to the experiences and perspectives of LGBTQ+ individuals in various fields, and highlight the benefits that can be gained from promoting greater inclusion and diversity.

In summary, the literature reviewed in this study contributes to a growing body of research that seeks to better understand the complex relationship between LGBTQ+ inclusion and various aspects of society, including economics, politics, and innovation. The studies highlight the impact of power relations, dominant narratives, and social attitudes on the experiences of marginalized communities, and call for greater attention to be paid to the voices and perspectives of these communities.
